ORDER

The Commission orders that —

1. The Surveyors' Assistants (State) Conciliation Committee published 18 June 1993 (275 I.G. 717) be dissolved.

2. There be established a new Surveyors' Assistants (State) Conciliation Committee for the industries and callings of —

Surveyors' Assistants in the State, excluding the County of Yancowinna;

excepting employees of —

State Rail Authority of New South Wales;

State Transit Authority of New South Wales;

The Water Board;

The Hunter District Water Board;

The Council of the City of Sydney;

Sydney Electricity;

The Electricity Commission of New South Wales, trading as Pacific Power;

The Broken Hill Proprietary Company Limited;

Shire and Municipal Councils;

Australian Iron and Steel Proprietary Limited, within the jurisdiction of the Iron and Steel Works Employees (Australian Iron & Steel Proprietary Limited) Conciliation Committee and the Quarries (Australian Iron and Steel Pty Limited) Conciliation Committee;

Australian Wire Industries Pty Ltd at its Newcastle Wiremill;

Blue Circle Southern Cement Limited;

The Council of the City of Newcastle;

The Australian Gas Light Company;

and excepting —

Employees within the jurisdiction of the following Conciliation Committees —

Special Steels and Steel Products Manufacture (Commonwealth Steel Company Limited);
Tubemakers of Australia Limited, Newcastle;
County Councils (Electricity Undertakings) Employees;
Crown Employees (General) (other than surveyors' labourers);
Crown Employees (Professional);
John Lysaght (Australia) Limited Newcastle;
John Lysaght (Australia) Limited Unanderra;
Cement Workers, &c. (State).

3. The said Committee shall consist of two representatives of employers and two representatives of employees.

4. The representatives of employers shall be appointed, upon nomination as prescribed, one by The Employers' Federation of New South Wales and one by the Department of Land and Water Conservation; alternatively, a deputy member or members may be appointed upon nomination by the Roads and Traffic Authority.

5. The representatives of employees shall be appointed, upon nomination as prescribed, by The AWU-FIME Amalgamated Union, New South Wales.

6. This order shall take effect on and from 27 October 1995.
